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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bob Clayton BC advised he has seen anti mining posters around Bargo – TS Project – ZA advised she would address this later in the meeting during the TS update. BC also advised he was to meet with two couples who met with the minister, but one wasn't available. Two couples had a meeting with Minister Anderson. Meeting organised for before Christmas but was rescheduled. One couple lives in Douglas park, then other couple lives locally and they had some concerns. In a June meeting someone from Engineering Emergency confirmed that NSW public works Advisory had been doing some works in the subsidence area. A few years ago, MSB knocked down their house and built a new one for the couple. Due to the change of MSB's management, the issue continued for years and subsidence issues were not fixed up. Minister Anderson indicated that their claim came under the old law but has since changed his mind and agreed it came under the new law. An inspection in 2018 found that foundations had not been constructed in accordance with subsidence standards. Door knocking by public works withdrew the initial review and stated they were conducting a new review. DP geotechnical engineers were engaged to assess. Concluded that the house was built to Class M, where by it should have been built to H1 or H2 standards. Subsidence at rear of the house measured at 62 mm, confirmed ongoing subsidence was estimated at 4.4 mm per year for the near future. Issues were due to the poorly built construction of the house that was not properly rectified by the builder, rather than being a subsidence issue. ZA advised that the committee needs to follow this up. MM recommended to refer the issue to SA NSW. Bob to forward details to MM for referral. ZA replied need to be clear on what we are asking them to do. MM replied that the TCCCC would merely refer to SA as an issue raised with us and not get involved. If SA NSW provides consent, Tahmoor Coal asks that they are constructed in alignment with set Guidelines. We don't stop mining but prefer not to have an increase in housing or stress. If covered, SA NSW still covers compensation. DA replied mine still has to make a profit. ZA replied it's up to the government to make the decision for the community regarding infrastructure to support residential development. RK asked how long could Bargo be deferred? ZA replied it could be 2022 to 2035 until its ok to build. MM asked whether subdivisions are in the spotlight if they're already rezoned? CM stated those proposed for new rezoning. CM added Clearview is different. MSB for years had to approve plans. BC asked if SA NSW still issues a certificate? ZA responded refer to SA NSW for clarification. MM asked was the community considered in EIS economics? ZA replied considered in document, balancing of offsets. CM stated economics for shire, originally covered by Wilton and not to spread over the shire. Original idea concentrated in Wilton. DA asked if anyone knew who the author of the latest letter is? AZ replied no, assuming property developer. JJ stated concern from community is that they are unsure of where everything is going, anxiety until confirmation.
