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| <p>8.1. Mine Update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Covid-19 situation is fairly stable. Continue to monitor available information and respond accordingly. • Longwall West 2 (LW W2) commenced mining on 7 December 2020. • TC production performance for LWW2 has been above budget and coal quality is very good, having record numbers of extraction • LWW2 expected to be completed mid-July 2021, and approximately 1.5years left in the Western Domain. • Development operations have kicked off in TC current mining lease in areas MGW3 and 902 Panel for MGW4. • Coking coal price continues to be challenged by Covid-19 related global effects, and the tensions between China and Australia – China not buying Australian coal. This has driven the coal price below the \$100 USD mark. <p>8.2. Tahmoor South:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On 17 December 2020, the Department of Planning, Industry & Environment (DPIE) recommended the Independent Planning Commission (IPC) approve the Tahmoor South Project. • The IPC held a site visit on 9 February 2021 which included a tour of the pit top, Tahmoor North mining area (including Thirlmere Lakes, Redbank and Myrtle Creeks) and Tahmoor South proposed mining area (including the Australian Wildlife Sanctuary, Dog Trap Creek and the REA). This included community representation (Julie Sheppard, NPA). • An applicant meeting was held on 10 February 2021 with the IPC Commissioners. • The Public Hearing occurred over a period of 3 days from 15 – 17 February 2021. • Key issues raised included potential subsidence and environmental impacts. • It is expected the IPC will make their final determination on the project by 19 April 2021. <p>8.3. Tahmoor South Community Information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Local MP, Nathaniel Smith issued a media release opposing the project on 23 December 2020. • This media release was letterbox dropped to the Bargo community in January 2021. • Tahmoor Coal letterbox dropped an Information Booklet to Bargo residents in January 2021. • Mr Smith chaired a Community Meeting on 1 February 2021. • Mr Smith has declined to meet with Tahmoor Coal following multiple contact attempts made since early December 2020. • The Tahmoor South Project and IPC Hearing generated a large number of social media posts. • Multiple media stories on radio, television and newspaper. • Requests for individual property information have increased seeking subsidence predictions. • Further community engagement activities will continue once the IPC determination is known. | NOTE | | 04/03/21 | |
