Announcements from GFG regarding signing of an MOU for construction of an Electric Arc Furnace in Whyalla, as well as expansion of the Iron Ore mines to include production of Direct Reduced Iron (DRI) grade material. Supports the transition to Greensteel. PV to provide more information on the Electric Arc Furnace at the next meeting. 8.2.	Safeguard Mechanism: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Safeguard Mechanism is the Australian Government's policy for reducing emissions at Australia's largest industrial facilities, including Tahmoor Coal. 			



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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It sets legislated limits—known as baselines—on the greenhouse gas emissions of these facilities. Potential for significant cost to Tahmoor Coal if not mitigated to approximately 5% improvement per year. Mitigation early investigations have commenced. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> DH asked if Scope 3 emissions are being looked at. PV advised not at this stage. JJ asked about power generation instead of flaring methane. PV advised if we captured enough, we would look to use it. MM sought clarification that the catalytic converter option converts methane to water and CO2. PV confirmed. <p>8.3. GFG Foundation update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The GFG Foundation kicked off on Wednesday 17 May, the first intake of students for Tahmoor. 30 Year 9 and 10 students from Picton High School and Wollondilly Anglican College had their first day with the program at the Tahmoor Community Hall. They heard from GFG Foundation General Manager Georgina Crumpton, who had travelled from the London offices of GFG, and Foundation Chief Operating Officer Jonny Samengo. The GFG Foundation focuses on programs to support people, particularly young people, to reach their potential and strengthen industries and local communities by boosting skills and employment prospects. The GFG Foundation runs programs in areas that GFG Alliance has a significant presence in. These programs help give students important skills to help them towards being job-ready after school. These include STEM based learning programs, designed to involve students in problem solving real-world issues that are happening in their local communities. The first session was an open invitation for parents as the students got to meet the ten mentors from Tahmoor Coal that will be guiding them through their weekly learning sessions during school terms 2 and 3.
