7.5.	Nicole Pearce (via message) – Asked is it possible for Tahmoor Coking Coal to display signage like South32 (GM-3) does when conducting blasting activities. PV advised it is very rare that Tahmoor Coal conducts blasting underground and when we do it is minor and localised, 350m to 400m underground. This cannot be heard or felt on the surface. Following the meeting, Tahmoor Coal contacted GM-3 who advised the following information: <i>GM-3 do not have any blast signage related to underground blasting. The blast signage we have on display relates to the current construction of the two ventilation shafts being sunk at Menangle. We’ve been blasting from about 15m from surface slowly downward. The blast notification board is a condition of our blast management plan as its right next to Menangle Road. We do not display signage for underground blasting as residents cannot hear or feel it at the surface from our mining operations.</i>	NOTE		05/12/24

8.1.	Mine Update: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Longwall production has continued to exceed budget targets, with the month of October resulting in record ROM production, and the best roadway development metres since 2003.</li><li>Coal Handling Prep Plant (CHPP) operating performance has been optimised to deal with the thinner seam and higher dilution, allowing higher throughput, and the construction of the sands plant is well advanced.</li><li>Application for additional longwall South 7A submitted in May, feedback received, responses submitted to Department of Planning, Housing &amp; Infrastructure (DPHI) in November, awaiting determination.</li><li>Investigations into carbon emission reduction strategies ongoing, with focus on Ventilation Air Management (VAM) as well as conversion of extracted gas to electricity.</li><li>Coal price in the last 3 months has been steady just above \$200/t USD. Supply and demand remain muted, with slowdown in China and reduced steelmaking in India and Japan.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>BC asked what percentage of Tahmoor’s coal is sold domestically. Environmental observations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>No observed subsidence-related impacts to the following environmental features in the last 6 months: cliffs, natural steep slopes, agricultural land, Aboriginal heritage rock shelter, historical heritage items, ecology - terrestrial &amp; threatened ecology, threatened flora and fauna.</li><li>Level 1 Trigger Action Response Plan (TARP) trigger at Farm Dam FD18 due to seepage following rain event during October inspection.
