6.2. Nicole Pearce:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Received a question from Karen regarding the unpaid coal royalties of \$30M owed to NSW government, is that from last quarter or what period? PV advised it is over the last 12-18 months. Is the water trough at the back of Wirrimbirra still set up and monitored for the wildlife? AB confirmed that it is still in place. Regarding the claim compensation deed, can the committee get a copy from Subsidence Advisory NSW? AB advised to email subsidenceadvisory@customerservice.nsw.gov.au to request a copy of the new deed template. It is typically only provided to residents with claims lodged and not distributed more broadly. As per the new legislated Claims Guidelines, deeds are a requirement for claim settlement where compensation is over \$10,000. 	NOTE		04/12/25

7. Mining Operations Update – Mine Update (presented by Peter Vale)				
7.1. Mine Update:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As previously noted, in February 2025 the workforce was advised that no further work was possible at Tahmoor due to business financial constraints, and they were to remain at home on standby on full pay. Since the last meeting, payments ceased to RStar Mining which is our main underground contracting workforce and their employees were stood down without pay. In light of this, only Tahmoor Coal employees are continuing to be paid. The RStar workforce makes up about 45% of the whole Tahmoor workforce. In total, we have seen turnover of about 60% of the Tahmoor workforce to date (including RStar) due to the ongoing uncertainties. With the reduced workforce, it will make the mine restart quite challenging. At this stage, it will likely take between 2-3 months to restart the mine when funds become available and the restart will be with a reduced workforce until a recruitment program can be implemented. It will take some time to be fully operating like we were a year ago. We have continued with reduced operations in parts of the mine since early December 2024 and continue to keep the underground environment compliant and safe with a small 	NOTE		04/12/25



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	<p>number of workers coming in every shift 24 hours a day.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In early November, GFG put Liberty Primary Metals Australia (LPMA) which is the owner of the shares of Tahmoor Coal, into voluntary administration due to debts owed to LPMA creditors. This does not directly affect Tahmoor, but Tahmoor is an asset owned by LPMA and is also a creditor to LPMA. There was a first hearing of creditors in the voluntary administration process which follows a very defined legal process to determine how a proposal is put to the creditors with the aim to maximise the return to the creditors. A proposal by the LPMA administrators was due to be issued on Monday 8 December. Media reports have identified that 3DSI and RStar Mining have submitted expressions of interest in purchase of Tahmoor mine. Hopefully within a month we will know if any solid bids are submitted. There is also a separate matter we discussed at the last meeting about the wind up application of Tahmoor Coal made by Coal Services. Additional businesses owed money by Tahmoor have also joined this application. The case has been adjourned a number of times and the next hearing date is scheduled for Monday 15 December. It may be further adjourned in light of the expressions of interest received by 3DSI and RStar Mining to purchase Tahmoor. In parallel, GFG are still continuing down a path to secure funding to restart the mine. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> MM asked in terms of the potential buyers, have they commenced due diligence? PV confirmed both parties have due diligence underway. PR asked do the two companies interested in purchasing Tahmoor run other mines? PV advised that RStar Mining's primary business is supplying labour to Tahmoor and they don't run any mines. Nor do 3DSI who are a strategic investment company, but they do have a strong mining team. PR asked do you think there will be issues with recruitment? PV commented it will likely be dependent on a number of factors. A new owner may attract a fresh start and encourage former workers to return to Tahmoor. 	NOTE		04/12/25
